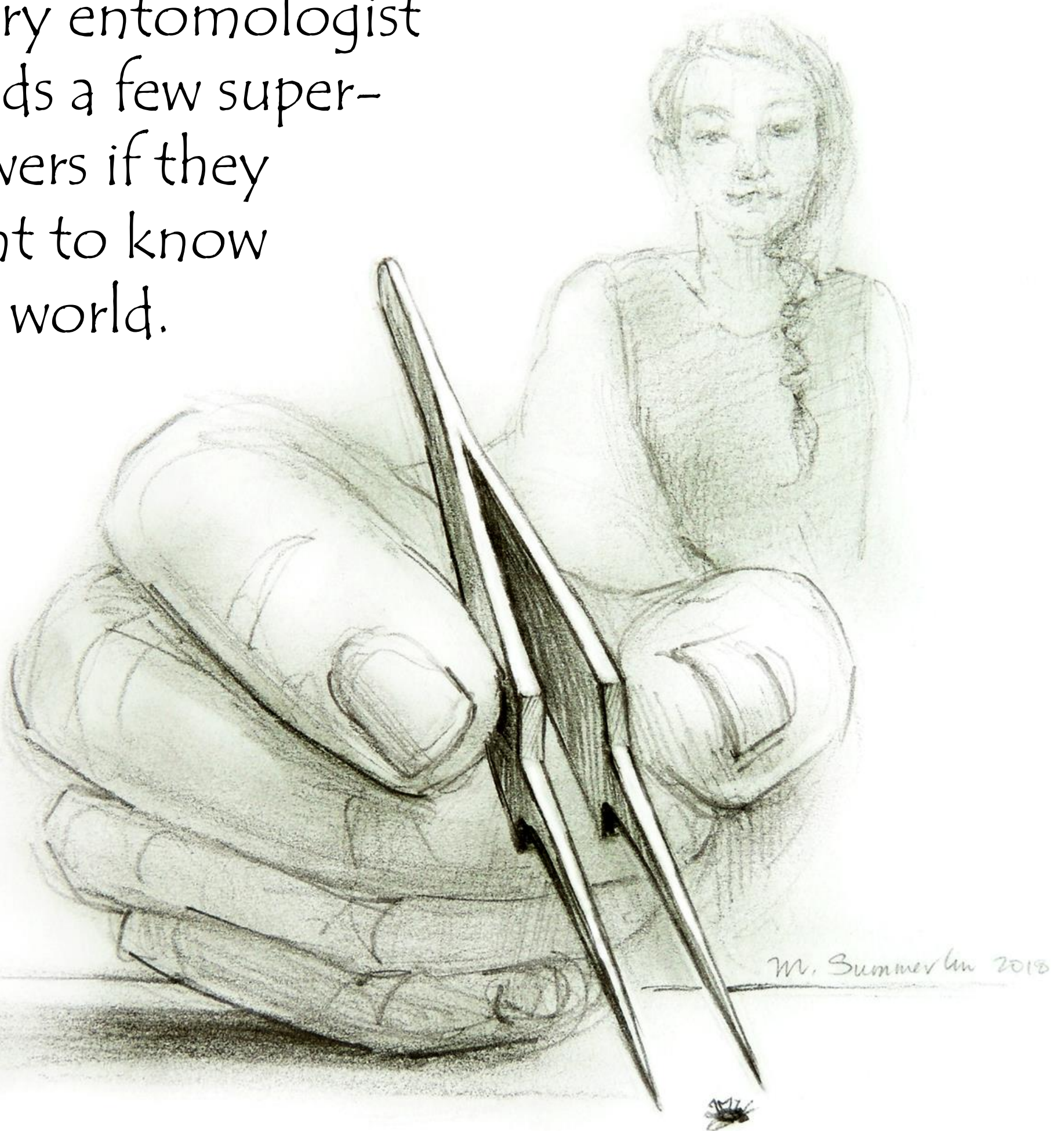


Every entomologist
